

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF
THE TOWN OF FORT MYERS BEACH, FLORIDA
RESOLUTION NUMBER 02-42

WHEREAS, issues regarding the flow of traffic on and off of Estero Island have come before the Council for consideration, and
WHEREAS, one of the suggested remedies for the traffic congestion experienced during our peak traffic season is an Alternating Lane Traffic Control Device to be placed at the intersection of Prescott and San Carlos Blvd, and
WHEREAS, the County has devised a plan whereby the area around Prescott and San Carlos Blvd, within the County's jurisdiction, can be served by one of these devices, and
WHEREAS, this plan also involves the reconfiguration of traffic flow lanes as well as the installation of the Alternating Lane Traffic Control Device, and
WHEREAS, it is the consensus of the Council that this plan will result in a more positive and less stressful traveling experience for those people traveling to the Town,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN COUNCIL FOR THE TOWN OF FORT MYERS BEACH,
HEREBY signifies its' support for the plan as proposed by Lee County, and
HEREBY encourages the County to proceed to implement the plan this peak traffic season, and
HEREBY encourages the State Department Of Transportation to allow for the implementation of this plan by Lee County on a temporary basis this peak traffic season, and
HEREBY encourages the State to implement this plan on a permanent basis by including it in the States ongoing Capital Improvement Budget in future years.


The foregoing resolution was adopted by the Fort Myers Beach Town Council upon being put to a vote, the result was as follows:




