Hurricane Idalia aftermath: *Utilities update* Wednesday, August 30, 2023 – 6:30 p.m.

Town of Fort Myers Beach, FL – Tropical Storm/Hurricane Idalia impacted the Town overnight with high winds, rain, some storm surge, and localized flooding. Here are some things to know about the utilities after the storm:

- 1) Properties in the Town did not experience any water losses and there is not a boil water notice in place. The water is safe to use and consume.
- 2) Earthview LLC is working on the stormwater systems in the Town to clean them which will help standing water go down. If your street is still experiencing standing water, Earthview will get to it.
- 3) Localized flooding is still occurring on some streets including First, Second, Crescent, and part of Old San Carlos. These streets are closed.
- 4) Lee County Waste Management will perform regular trash pickups on Thursday, August 31, 2023.
