Mats for wheelchair access to the beach have been re-installed at four locations

Town of Fort Myers Beach, FL – Non-slip wheelchair beach access mats (Mobi-Mats) have been re-installed at four of the busiest beach accesses on the North end of Estero Island.


Here are the locations:

- #35 (Avenue A)
- #34 (Avenue C)
- #33 (Alva Drive)
- #27 (Mango Street)

As beach sand can be replaced on the pathways and additional mats can be sourced, mats will be installed at additional beach accesses.

The mats that were previously in place at beach accesses were destroyed or washed away by Hurricane Ian on September 28, 2022.
