A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF FORT MYERS BEACH in support of the Conservation Amendment, also known as Amendment 5 on the November 3, 1998 Election Ballot

WHEREAS, the Town of Fort Myers Beach has benefited from the granting opportunities provided by the Florida Communities Trust by receiving a grant in excess of \$1 million dollars to purchase the Mound House; and

WHEREAS, funding for Preservation 2000 and funding for the Florida Communities Trust will end this year unless Amendment 5 passes and extends authorization to continue programs like Preservation 2000; and

WHEREAS, both gubernatorial candidates, most legislative candidates, many newspapers and League of Women Voters have expressed support for Amendment 5; and

WHEREAS, the Conservation Amendment will help to support and protect open space in our community and other communities throughout Florida; and



The foregoing Resolution was adopted by the Town Council upon a motion and second and, upon being put to a vote, the result was as follows:




