

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF
FORT MYERS BEACH, FLORIDA
RESOLUTION NUMBER 05-39**

WHEREAS, on October 23, 2005, the Town Council of the Town of Fort Myers Beach, Florida imposed an 72-hour extension of the emergency initial building moratorium pursuant to Town Ordinance 96-19 (as amended), in Emergency Resolution No. 05-35, for reasons related to Hurricane Wilma as set forth in said Resolution; and

WHEREAS, various other emergency building-related moratoria automatically went into effect at that time, pursuant to the requirements of Town Ordinance 96-19; and

WHEREAS, repeal of any remaining emergency building moratoria related to Hurricane Wilma is permitted under Section 10(C)(9) of Town Ordinance 96-19; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that the need for the continuation of such emergency building moratoria has passed with regard to Hurricane Wilma and that repeal of all remaining emergency building moratoria regarding Hurricane Wilma within the Town of Fort Myers Beach is in the best interest of public safety, health and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

Section 1. Based upon the forgoing findings, the Town Council hereby repeals all remaining emergency building moratoria regarding Hurricane Wilma. The Town Council finds that this action is in the best interests of the public health, safety, and welfare for all persons within the territorial boundaries of Fort Myers Beach, Florida.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.


