

## **Mound House Tourism & Environmental Programs: Thursday, May 19 Through Saturday, May 28, 2022**

With the Memorial Day Holiday Weekend right around the corner, now in the ideal time to visit the iconic Mound House on Fort Myers Beach! One of Southwest Florida's most-beloved historic attractions, the Mound House traces its roots to the ancient Calusa of over 2,000 years ago. As the oldest standing structure on Estero Island, the Town of Fort Myers Beach operates the Mound House as a museum complex and cultural and environmental learning experience that offers numerous monthly tourism and environmental programs, including for kids.

The Mound House debuts two new programs this week. "Turtles of Southwest Florida" is for ages 12 & up on Saturday, May 21, at 11 a.m. Learn about the various Southwest Florida turtle species and what we can do to protect them. "Shell & Tell" for ages 12 & up is on Friday, May 27, at 11 a.m. The ancient Calusa used shells for over a thousand years in their everyday lives, so this is the ideal opportunity to learn about the various shell species you find on the beach as well as their biology and importance to our ecosystem. Both new programs are at Newton Beach Park that is mid-island at 4650 Estero Boulevard; \$5-per-person with Mound House members free and Social Distancing guidelines in place.

The Mound House is open Tuesdays through Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., enforces Social Distancing and requests that all unvaccinated visitors wear masks. It is at 451 Connecticut Street with overflow parking at 216 Connecticut. Admission is \$10 for ages 13 & up, \$8 for students with IDs, \$5 ages 6 to 12, and 5 & under free, with Fort Myers Beach residents receiving a 50% museum admission discount. ### **Shell Mound Tour**

For all ages every May Tuesday through Saturday at 11 a.m. & 1 p.m.

If you dig archaeology, the Mound House's signature program is for you! Tour the one-of-a-kind underground 2,000-year-old Calusa Indian Shell Mound led by the interpretive staff as you explore the site's archaeology to unearth clues about this ancient society. \$5-per-person that does not include Mound House admission; Mound House members free with Social Distancing guidelines in place.

### **FREE: Newton Beach Park Guided Beach Walk**

For all ages every Tuesday and Thursday weather permitting at 9 a.m.

This twice-weekly free outdoor nature program is different every single time, as the "Guided Beach Walks" have a simple premise – walk roughly a half-mile down the

beach and back, discussing whatever you find that morning. Meet at the thatched hut closest to the beach, with Social Distancing in place. Bring sunscreen, shoes to get wet, sunglasses and hat. No reservations necessary; while free, parking is \$5-per-hour, with one hour generally enough. Newton Beach Park is mid-island at 4650 Estero Boulevard.

### **Cool Calusa Tools**

For families with kids 6 & older every May Tuesday, Thursday, & Saturday at 10 a.m.

Learn to hunt, fish, and make masks and pottery, just like the Calusa! The Mound House interpretive staff leads this exciting hands-on tour of the Mound House grounds, demonstrating Calusa tools and artifacts, then help you make Calusa-inspired artwork where your imagination runs wild! \$5-per-person that does not include Mound House admission, with Mound House members free and Social Distancing guidelines in place.

### **Garden Tour**

For all ages every May Tuesday & Friday at 2 p.m.

Stroll through the Mound House gardens to discover how its unique plants conserve water and protect wildlife, while learning how the Calusa and other Native Americans used them in their daily lives. \$5-per-person that does not include Mound House admission; Mound House members free with Social Distancing guidelines in place.

### **Guided Kayak Tour**

For ages 12 & up every May Wednesday through Saturday at 9 a.m.

Explore the winding mangrove creeks and hidden waters of the Estero Bay Aquatic Preserve as only a kayaker can on this Environmental Educator-guided tour of the ancient realm of the Calusa! Witness birds, fish, manatee and dolphins as you paddle through the natural beauty of Estero and Hell Peckney Bays in a tandem kayak. All paddling & safety equipment provided; \$45-per-person with Mound House members \$15 that includes Mound House admission. ### **Archaeology: Can You Dig It?**

### **Latino History Tour**

For all ages every May Wednesday at 2 p.m.

Perfect for Florida history buffs! Learn about the Latino fishing village known as a “Rancho” that existed on the shell mound between the ancient Calusa and Anglo-Pioneer eras. Explore the site’s archaeology and history through unearthed clues about this multicultural society. \$5-per-person that does not include Mound House admission, with Mound House members free and Social Distancing guidelines in place.

### **Untold Stories Tour**

For adults every May Thursday at 2 p.m.

The Mound House is the oldest standing structure on Fort Myers Beach, with an intriguing cast of characters who called it home, ranging from farmers to casino owners; scientists to developers! Learn about their individual stories along with a good dose of island history on this guided tour through the Mound House Museum, native gardens, and majestic grounds. Adults \$15; Mound House members free with Social Distancing guidelines in place.
