

**Mound House Tourism & Environmental Programs:
Thursday, September 8 Through Saturday, September 17, 2022**

With the Labor Day Weekend over, the next two months are the slowest time of year on Fort Myers Beach, making this your ideal opportunity to visit the iconic Mound House! One of Southwest Florida's most-beloved historic attractions, the Mound House traces its roots to the ancient Calusa of over 2,000 years ago. As the oldest standing structure on Estero Island, the Town of Fort Myers Beach operates the Mound House as a museum complex and cultural and environmental learning experience that offers numerous monthly tourism and environmental programs, including for kids.

Mound House Environmental Educator Yvette Carrasco concludes the "2022 Summer Lecture Series" with "Butterflies on The Bay" for adults only on Tuesday, September 13, with a wine-&-refreshments reception at 5:30 p.m. and program from 6 to 7 p.m. Yvette provides a closer examination of the endangered Atala Butterfly as well as other Fort Myers Beach butterflies. Due to limited seating, the Mound House requires advance reservations at 239-765-0865; \$7 for Mound House members & \$12 for non-members.

The Mound House, on the National Register of Historic Places and featuring the one-of-a-kind underground Calusa Indian Shell Mound, is open Tuesdays through Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. It is at 451 Connecticut Street with overflow parking at 216 Connecticut. Admission is \$10 for ages 13 & up, \$8 for students with IDs, \$5 ages 6 to 12, and 5 & under free, with Fort Myers Beach residents receiving a 50% museum admission discount. Shell Mound Tour

For all ages every September Tuesday through Saturday at 11 a.m. & 1 p.m.

If you dig archaeology, the Mound House's signature program is for you! Tour the one-of-a-kind underground 2,000-year-old Calusa Indian Shell Mound led by the interpretive staff as you explore the site's archaeology to unearth clues about this ancient society. \$5-per-person that does not include Mound House admission, with Mound House members free.

FREE: Newton Beach Park Guided Beach Walk

For all ages every Tuesday and Thursday weather permitting at 9 a.m.

This twice-weekly free outdoor nature program is different every single time, as the “Guided Beach Walks” have a simple premise – walk roughly a half-mile down the beach and back, discussing whatever you find that morning. Meet at the thatched hut closest to the beach and bring sunscreen, shoes to get wet, sunglasses and hat. No reservations necessary; while free, parking is \$5-per-hour, with one hour generally enough. Newton Beach Park is mid-island at 4650 Estero Boulevard.

Guided Kayak Tour

For ages 12 & up on Thursday, September 8; Saturday, September 10; Wednesday, September 14; & Friday, September 16, all at 9 a.m.

Explore the winding mangrove creeks and hidden waters of the Estero Bay Aquatic Preserve as only a kayaker can on this Environmental Educator-guided tour! Witness birds, fish, manatee and dolphins as you paddle through the natural beauty of Estero and Hell Peckney Bays in a tandem kayak. All paddling & safety equipment provided; \$45-per-person with Mound House members \$15 that includes Mound House admission. Advance reservations necessary at www.moundhouse.org.

Archaeology: Can You Dig It?

Explore the site’s archaeology and history through unearthed clues about this multicultural society. \$5-per-person that does not include Mound House admission, with Mound House members free.

Family Fun Kayak Tour

For ages 6 & up weather permitting on Friday, September 9; Thursday, September 15; & Saturday, September 17, all at 9 a.m.

This specially-designed Environmental Educator-guided kayak tour is perfect fun for families with children ages 6 & up! See birds, dolphins, manatee, and other wildlife while

paddling through the Estero Bay mangroves. \$25-per-person ages 13 & up; \$15-per-person ages 6 to 12 that includes Mound House admission. The Mound House provides all padding equipment; advance registrations necessary at www.moundhouse.org.
